Junior Cycle

As part of the revised Junior Cycle, students will study 9 subjects and 2 short courses. Everyone will study Irish, English, Maths, Science, History, French/Spanish and select from a range of other subjects. (See page 8)

Academic Excellence

High quality teaching and learning is paramount in our college. Students are consistently encouraged to do their best, and are supported by a year long, one to one academic mentoring programme. Success in examinations is vigorously pursued at both Higher and Ordinary level. Specific recommendations on homework and the use of a Homework Journal are issued by the college for the benefit of both students and parents/guardians. Magh Éne has adopted a whole school approach to Assessment for Learning and Instructional Intelligence ensuring that each student receives the very best of progressive and effective teaching and learning methodologies.

A tradition of excellent Junior Certificate and Leaving Certificate results exists in Magh Éne. The majority of our students on an annual basis progress to third level pursuing a wide range of career opportunities.

Transition Year

The Transition Year in Magh Éne College is firmly based on the ethos of TY in that it aims to develop autonomous young adults equipped with the skills required to cope with the demands of Leaving Certificate as well as the challenges faced at third level and in the workplace. We are very proud of our long tradition in delivering a comprehensive Transition Year programme which supports and aids our students in bridging the gap between Junior Cert and Leaving Cert.

LCVP

The Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme involves undertaking two additional subjects: Enterprise Education and Preparation for the World of Work. The LCVP yields significant additional points within the CAO system of application for third level places. A Distinction in LCVP is awarded 66 points in the Leaving Certificate examination.






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Information and Communication Technologies (ICT)

ICT is integrated across all areas of the curriculum with First Years having weekly timetabled classes. This is supplemented with portable 30 unit Chromebook trollies which can be used by students in any of the college's classrooms. Each classroom is fitted with a large interactive Smart screen which has replaced the traditional white board.





Students now use Google Classroom which allows them to access class and homework through 'cloud' using their own unique Co Donegal ETB e-mail address. Each of our students has also been given free cloud storage space for their files and folders. Google Classroom is designed to help teachers create and collect assignments paperlessly, including time-saving features like the ability to automatically make a copy of a Google Document for each student. It also creates Drive folders for each assignment and for each student to help keep everyone organised.


Students can keep track of what's due on the Assignments page and begin working with just a click. Teachers can quickly see who has or hasn't completed the work, and provide direct, real-time feedback and grades right in Classroom. Parents/Guardians can also have access to their own child's work.



Student Support

Students are encouraged to develop self confidence, take personal responsibility and show respect for self and others. They are expected to be hardworking and well behaved. Self expression is encouraged while a spirit of enquiry and a widening awareness of social values are promoted through many extra and co curricular activities provided in Magh Éne. Each student's talents are nurtured and encouraged.

Each student has a timetabled Tutor Class. Tutors look after the welfare of our students and liaise with Year Heads in ensuring each student fulfils their potential and is supported throughout their time with us here in Magh Éne. Our Student Support Team monitors and supports student welfare.



Guidance

The Guidance Counsellor works with all years. A dedicated guidance programme is followed by senior students. Each student is monitored and advised throughout Transition, Fifth and Sixth Years. Students are helped with study plans, exam targets, college applications, career options and when required, personal counselling.

Regular Parents Information Evenings are held throughout the year aimed at supporting you and enabling us to work together. Students receive ongoing guidance from First Year on Study Plans, Career Choices and paths to third level.

Student Voice

An active Student Council contributes hugely to the life in Magh Éne. The Council holds regular meetings, and representatives from the Council attend meetings with the Principal and senior school management, to discuss and decide on many school issues throughout the year. Our students continue to be selected to represent the youth of the county on Co. Donegal Youth Council in the role as Youth Counsellors.

Student Leadership Programme

Aimed at enabling the development of young autonomous adults our Student Leadership Programme involves peer nomination of Class Prefects and Deputy Prefects who then go on to have a leadership role within the college. Student Leaders receive formal training to carry out their role. Through the course of the year our young leaders grow in confidence and go on to develop excellent communication, organisational and interpersonal skills. Being a member of our Student Leadership Team is a major accomplishment and something our students aspire to.

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Health Promoting Schools

Magh Ene College has been a Health Promoting School since the late 1990s. This initiative supports schools to focus on health and wellbeing and involves all members of the school community. Our Health Promoting Schools committee is made up of both staff and students. We raise awareness on many topics such as healthy eating, positive mental health, LGBTQI and the importance of physical activity for each student's wellbeing.

We promote these causes through activities and events such as Positive Mental Health Week and Stand Up Week. In recent years, we've been awarded the Health Promoting Schools flag. This was presented to us by the HSE as an acknowledgement of our work to help improve the health of our school community.

We've also received the Amber Flag from Mental Health Ireland in recognition of our work in promoting and actively bringing about a cultural change in the promotion of positive mental health within the education system.

Green Schools

We have been participating in the Green Schools scheme for several years and due to the hard work of our students and staff we have achieved both the Litter and Waste flag and the Water Conservation flag. We are currently working on the Sustainable Travel theme. Some of our initiatives that have been undertaken to make our school a more environmentally friendly place include the use of recycling bins in classrooms, the use of a rainwater harvester in the garden, various workshops, and the installation of a water fountain in the canteen area to reduce the number of plastic bottles being used in the school. We look forward to new members joining each year.
